Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

AAUW is a strong proponent of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI). Founded when women received little support in furthering their educations and had to fight against misinformation about the effect of higher education on their reproductive systems, the organization continues to fight against the gender pay gap, challenges to Title IX, and barriers and biases in outdated workplace models and more.

Each branch is asked to have a DEI Chair, a job I got because I was already chairing the Student Inclusion Awards committee. I find it very interesting and instructive. Besides presenting programming on DEI topics, we monitor our branch practices to understand just how inclusive we are - and how we may not be. Monthly zoom meetings help us as DEI chairs to share our practices and our problems. Sixty-four of us got together with Melissa LaDuke, AAUW's DEI Chair, and Cindy Shanahan, liaison between the national committee and the branches. We know Cindy from all her work with Virginia AAUW. We talked about the advantages and benefits of a diverse, equitable, and inclusive culture in our own branches. And there was great enthusiasm for our branch's Student Inclusion Award. September Program Review

On September 17, the Springfield-Annandale Branch partnered with Pohick Regional Library to host a community event, featuring Elisabeth Griffith, author of *Formidable, American Women and the Fight for Equality 1920-2020*. This historical outlook covers struggles, successes, obstacles, and failures on the road to equality of the last 100 years; since the Nineteenth Amendment was passed granting women the constitutional right to vote. The story involves primarily black and white women and includes contributions by minorities. *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post* solidly endorsed this book and Elisabeth Griffith did not disappoint in her presentation. Books were available for sale and signing after the event (the book is also available in the Fairfax County Public Library system). A future discussion of the book is being planned.

To understand the court system more fully, we cannot just concentrate on the United States Supreme Court, but must also learn about the history of Virginia's appellate courts and the judges and justices who have served.

On **November 19**, 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. at Pohick Regional Library, 6450 Sydenstricker Rd., Burke, Justice Thomas P. Mann will discuss the importance of the Virginia Supreme Court and some of the cases that have helped shape the commonwealth and the nation. He will also discuss the procedures of the court and how cases are appealed to the United States Supreme Court.

Thomas P. Mann received his J.D. from the American University, Washington College of law (1990). He served as a judge of the Juvenile and Domestic Relations Court, Fairfax (2006-2016) and Judge of the 19th Judicial Circuit (2016-2022). In June, Thomas Mann was elected by the General Assembly to serve on the Virginia Supreme Court for a twelve-year term beginning August 1, 2022. Join us for this very important meeting. 
Evening Book Group - Virtual


